Epilepsy Fellowship Opportunity Available for July 2023 (1 and 2-year Fellowships Available- optional second year in Clinical Neurophysiology)

The University of Wisconsin fellowship-training program in Epilepsy and/or Clinical Neurophysiology seeks neurology residents who have completed an accredited neurology residency (adult or child) in the US and who are dedicated to the care of people with diseases of the nervous system, have demonstrated interest in clinical and basic neuroscience, and show promise of future achievement. For over 50 years, the Department has been dedicated to training highly motivated physicians in an atmosphere that emphasizes teamwork, close interaction with attending physicians and resident colleagues, independence and development of sophisticated skills in epilepsy care including epilepsy surgery, ketogenic diet, RNS/DBS/VNS, stereoEEG, High-Density EEG, molecular imaging, and critical care EEG monitoring. Further training in clinical neurophysiology includes intraoperative monitoring including language and motor mapping, EMG/NCS and evoked potentials.

Available Rotations:

- 1-EEG including continuous EEG monitoring, epilepsy-monitoring unit with invasive ECOG and stereo-EEG studies
- 2-Clinical Epilepsy including devices and dietary therapies
- 3-Intraoperative Monitoring
- 4-EMG/Neuromuscular
- 5-Sleep

Research opportunities are available in critical care EEG, clinical epilepsy, and advanced neuroimaging. This includes the onsite Epilepsy Connectome Project, high-density EEG recordings during sleep and seizures, and molecular imaging with novel radiotracers.
